

Easter Fruit Tray

-whole pineapple, cored, peeled, and cut into cubes

- -2 large clusters of green grapes
- -3 oranges, peeled and sliced
- -whole cantaloupe, peeled and cut into cubes
- -quart strawberries, cored
- -2 cups blueberries
- -Fruit Dip recipe (see below)

Fruit Dip

-8 oz pkg cream cheese, softened

- -1 cup powdered sugar
- -1 cup whipping cream
- -1/4 cup granulated sugar
- -1/4 cup pineapple juice

-With an electric mixer, blend the cream cheese with the powdered sugar in a bowl and mix until smooth. Set aside.

-In another bowl, whip the cream and granulated sugar together until they form soft peaks.

-Add the powdered sugar mixture to the whipped cream and continue mixing with adding pineapple juice, a small amount at a time, until reaching the consistency desired for dipping fruit.

YIELD: 16 servings (about 1/4 cup each of fruit dip)

Deviled Eggs

-6 eggs

- -cold water
- -1/3 cup Miracle Whip
- -1/4 tsp pepper
- -1/2 tsp ranch dressing mix
- -1 tsp yellow mustard
- -paprika

-Place eggs in a saucepan filled with water and bring to a boil. Cook for 10-12 minutes.

-Cool the eggs in a bowl with cold water and peel. -Cut the eggs in half, lengthwise and remove the yolks. -Place the yolks in a bowl and mash and add all the ingredients except the paprika. Blend the mixture until smooth. Scoop the mixture into the egg white halves. -Sprinkle with paprika. Refrigerate until serving time. YIELD: 12 deviled eggs

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<u>Watermelon</u> Waldorf Salad

2 cups cubed watermelon (1/2-inch cubes) 1/2 cup sliced celery 1/2 cup seedless red grape halved Dash of salt 1/4 cup Greek yogurt



2 tablespoons sliced almonds, toasted

Stir watermelon, celery and grapes together in a bowl. Just before serving, stir salt into yogurt for dressing. You may want to add a little water to lighten the thickness. Pour mixture over fruit, and stir until coated. Sprinkle with almonds.

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
